Safety Management

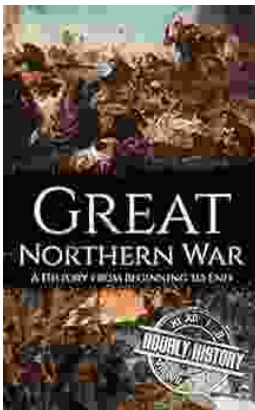
