Army Techniques Publication (ATP) 02-42, Army Health System Support to Stability, provides guidance on the Army Health System's (AHS's) role in supporting stability operations. Stability operations are defined as "military operations taken by a commander to maintain or re-establish a secure environment, provide essential governance and basic services to the population, and facilitate the extension of host nation authority and legitimacy."

ATP 02-42 is intended to help AHS personnel understand their role in stability operations and to provide them with the tools and techniques needed to effectively support these operations.

- The AHS's role in stability operations
- The planning and execution of AHS support to stability operations
- The coordination of AHS support with other agencies and organizations
- The assessment of AHS support to stability operations

The following are some of the key concepts discussed in ATP 02-42:

- Stability operations: Stability operations are military operations taken by a commander to maintain or re-establish a secure environment, provide essential governance and basic services to the population, and facilitate the extension of host nation authority and legitimacy.
- The AHS's role in stability operations: The AHS plays a vital role in stability operations by providing医疗care, public health services, and veterinary services to the population. The AHS also helps to train and equip host nation medical personnel and to develop host nation health systems.
