
The Granta of the African Short Story

Granta Anthologies have been showcasing some of the best new writing from around the world for over 40 years. In recent years, they have turned their attention to the African short story, with two anthologies published in 2012 and 2019.



The Granta of the African Short Story: Volume 1 featured stories from 21 African writers, including Chimamanda Ngozi Adichie, Zadie Smith, and Dave Eggers. Here is a closer look at some of the stories in the two anthologies:


Volume 1

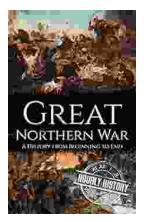
